



The **Education Committee** continued to develop the chamber's Certificate of Employability workshops. Focusing on essential skills and career pathways in the Sauk Valley this initiative continues to grow and bridge the gap between education and employers. This year, 100 high school students completed the program.



57th annual Charles Farnham Golf Outing. Thanks to the incredible support of sponsors and 128 golfers, this event raised funds for business scholarships and supports local workforce development efforts.



Steak Fry in the Country. Held in August, this event welcomed over 380 supporters, and raised over \$40,000 to support Ag education in the Sauk Valley.



70th annual Fiesta Parade & Celebration. Over 4,000 people enjoyed a day of celebrating Hispanic heritage in the Sauk Valley at the Fiesta Parade and Celebration at Grandon Civic Center.





The **Professional Women's Network** organized two incredible workshops in 2023. **Manufacturing Dinner.** Over 180 supporters of the manufacturing industry joined together at the fifth annual event

to celebrate manufacturing in the Sauk Valley.



In 2023 the SVACC provided value to membership through opportunities:

- **TO CONNECT** through Business After Hours, the Annual Dinner and Meeting, Golf Outing, Agribusiness Steak Fry in the Country, Manufacturing Dinner, and various committee participation.
- **TO LEARN** by attending two Professional Women's Network workshops, Legislative Updates with the United State Chamber of Commerce and Illinois Chamber of Commerce, and a Lunch & Learn on state legislation impacting our members.
- **TO ENGAGE** through getting involved and impacting change by participating on one of the Chamber committees, the Childcare Task Force, Manufacturing Virtual Roundtables, Sights and Sounds, and Hot Dog Days.
- **TO PROMOTE** their business or organization through ribbon cuttings, adblasts, the SVACC Newsletter, and participating in new resident information packets.

We continued to advocate for our members at the local, state, and national level on relevant business issues. Organizing local candidate forums for elected officials, supporting the WCHCP legislative luncheon, and hosting workshops on state and federal legislative issues are a few of the ways we advocated for our members in 2023.

Strengthen the Local Community

The Chamber worked diligently to keep the Sauk Valley moving forward and ensuring the business community was part of community initiatives. over the past year.

- Workforce Development initiatives continued to make an impact, connecting the business community and education, employers and students. 100 students from local high schools participated in the SVACC Certificate of Employability Workshop to gain information on local career pathways and essential skills needed in the workplace.
- Over \$21,000 in scholarships was allocated by the SVACC to local students pursuing careers in agriculture, business, or manufacturing. Scholarships were also allocated for a student of Hispanic heritage.
- The SVACC convened key community partners as part of the Childcare Task Force to address local childcare challenges and develop solutions by engaging employers, education systems, childcare providers, and organizations working with job seekers. The Chamber engaged elected officials in this initiative and participated in conversations with DCFS and IDHS.
- As part of the Sterling Riverfront Commission, the Chamber collaborated with the City of Sterling for continued progress on the Sterling Riverfront Reimagined project.

Enhance Community Leadership

The Chamber continued to promote and support leadership initiatives throughout the Sauk Valley.

- Now in its 8th year, the Sauk Valley Community Leadership Program continues to provide incredible opportunities for professional and personal growth. The 2022-23 cohort graduated 21 participants and the fall of 2023 welcomed 15 new participants to the program.
- In its 11th year, the WACC CEO program continues to provide area high schools students a unique experience to explore entrepreneurship, learn more about career pathways in the Sauk Valley, and meet key community leaders.
- Sauk Valley Keystone Group is an initiative that brings together Generation Z and Millennials interested in getting involved in the community. In 2023 topics of interest included housing, livability/quality of life amenities, and the Sterling Riverfront development.
