

## Early Childhood Governance Transition Planning Continues

The state has established the Early Childhood and Care Transition Advisory Committee (TAC), comprised of parents, providers, advocates, and experts with diverse perspectives from across the state, to serve as an external advisory committee as the state moves toward a single early childhood agency.





Currently, The majority of early childhood services for babies, toddlers and young children are split among three state agencies - the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS), the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE), and the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS). A new state agency, the Department of Early Childhood will unite the majority of early childhood services into one place, making it easier for families to access critical services for stronger coordination between the various early childhood programs and services provided by the state.

## Workforce Development

The SVACC has offered the Certificate of Employability workshop for high schools students since 2018. This workshop has impacted several hundred students at local high schools in the Sauk Valley. We are preparing for 2024-25 school year and will be seeking sponsors to support the growth of this initiative. The attached booklet will go out to area high schools to promote the program.

Upon completion of the program, students can earn a **Certificate of Employability** which they can attach to job applications, showing the extra effort they have committed to their future.




Guest Editorial the Backery on Science Ridge The Place to Stay when Family's Away 815-626-0164
