

Government Affairs

Illinois lawmakers concluded their spring session by enacting a law that makes the state the first in the nation to ban banks and credit card companies from charging retailers fees on sales taxes and tips. The law, which takes effect on July 1, 2025, is expected to face significant opposition from financial institutions that argue the measure is impractical and difficult to implement within the allotted timeframe.

The legislation prohibits credit card companies from applying interchange fees to sales taxes and gratuities in electronic transactions. Additionally, it prevents these companies from increasing other fees to offset the revenue loss resulting from this change. For merchants without advanced point-of-sale (POS) systems capable of separately submitting taxes and gratuities, the law provides a credit for the interchange fees charged.

Non-compliance with the law will result in fines of \$1,000 per transaction. As the state prepares for potential legal challenges and the practicalities of enforcement, this legislation marks a significant shift in how electronic transaction fees are regulated in Illinois.
